

2011 Summer Grants

Dear Applicant:

Thank you very much for your interest in a Schoerke Foundation grant to study with our scholarship students in Ghana this summer. Based in Westtown, Pennsylvania, the Schoerke Foundation is a 501(c)(3) organization which provides scholarships for students in Ghana and grants for American students to attend a three-week summer program in Ghana. This year the program will run from July 30 to August 20, 2011; and we are awarding four grants worth \$850.00 each to current juniors and seniors in high school as well as freshmen and sophomores in college to cover living expenses in Ghana. The children and close relatives of Schoerke Foundation board members are not eligible for these grants. Successful applicants are responsible for their plane ticket, travel insurance, visa applications fees, and any other trip expenses not covered by the grant.

The **deadline** for applications is **EXTENDED** to February 15, 2011.

During the three weeks in Ghana, grant recipients will live in a house with other American high school students and a group of volunteer teachers. We will all go to school from 8.30 am to 3.30 pm, Monday to Friday, to teach reading, American history, English, Math, Science or Computer Science to the younger students at Heritage Academy. Also, the grant recipients and their counterparts in Ghana will attend workshops on globalization, poverty eradication, sustainability, and cultural arts such as basket weaving, drumming, and bead making. Grant recipients will have a chance to lead discussions on American culture or a mini-workshop for the younger students at Heritage.

On the weekends, the American students and volunteer teachers will visit educational and historical sites such as the slave castles in Cape Coast and Elmina, the Kakum Forest Reserve, and the W.E.B Dubois Museum. The summer program is designed to provide educational enrichment and a true cultural exchange between the American students and their Ghanaian counterparts.
